Slip and Fall Liability Claims: 'Tis the Season

Course Description

A slip (or trip) and fall often results in serious injury leaving the injured victims to face months and sometimes years of treatment before they return to a productive role in society. Such claims create multiple opportunities for fraud as claimants can often fabricate, or contribute to, the very circumstances they allege caused their injuries.

Topics discussed support participants understanding of the unique nature of slip and fall liability claims and the laws that influence the determination of legal responsibility. Participants explore the processes involved in investigating, negotiating and settling slip and fall liability claims. Participants discuss common injuries and treatment, discover the challenges faced in settling such claims and apply strategies for successful investigation.
